7th Sunday After Easter

In these days between Ascension and Pentecost, we gather with the disciples in the upper room, waiting for the Spirit to transform the church around the world. In today's gospel Jesus prays for his followers and for their mission in his name. Amid religious, social, and economic divisions, we seek the unity that Jesus had with his Father. Made one in baptism, we go forth to live our faith in the world, eager for the unity that God intends for the whole human family.

John 17:1-11

¹After Jesus had spoken these words [to his disciples], he looked up to heaven and said, "Father, the hour has come; glorify your Son so that the Son may glorify you, ²since you have given him authority over all people, to give eternal life to all whom you have given him. ³And this is eternal life, that they may know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent. ⁴I glorified you on earth by finishing the work that you gave me to do. ⁵So now, Father, glorify me in your own presence with the glory that I had in your presence before the world existed.

⁶"I have made your name known to those whom you gave me from the world. They were yours, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. ⁷Now they know that everything you have given me is from you; ⁸for the words that you gave to me I have given to them, and they have received them and know in truth that I came from you; and they have believed that you sent me. ⁹I am asking on their behalf; I am not asking on behalf of the world, but on behalf of those whom you gave me, because they are yours. ¹⁰All mine are yours, and yours are mine; and I have been glorified in them. ¹¹And now I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one, as we are one."

Music Notes for Sunday May 21st



May 21st:

"Holy Father, protect them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one, as we are one." (John 17:11) Is the last sentence in this week's Gospel reading. The Choir sings at the First Service, "Do Not Be Afraid" by John Helgen. The lyric is taken from Isaiah 43:1-5 and reassures the listener that we belong to God. Flutist, Janet Porterfield joins the choir.

Organ Pipes: This Sunday's, May 21st prelude is "Sun of My Soul" arranged by Benton Price. Based on the tune Hursley which in turn is based on the old Latin hymn Te

Deum. It first appeared as an anonymous melody in Vienna around 1774. That older form is often used with another hymn, "Holy God, We Praise Thy Name."




JENNIFER RONAN RICHTER and KEVIN RICHTER


